

Victor's Vision – Fast Facts



Victor's Vision is a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization that serves underserved youth in northern Peru by empowering our students with the resources they need to pursue their dreams through education. Victor's Vision's comprehensive after-school programming is a multi-pronged approach to address student needs:

Academic Classes: Victor's Vision students participate in three extra hours of schooling, five days a week, with an average student teacher ratio of 9:1. That's 4,800 supplemental hours of academic support before secondary school graduation.

Nutrition: Among primary-aged students living in the Chulucanas region, 52% are malnourished. Victor's Vision provides a balanced meal to each student every day they attend programming.

Social Emotional Learning: All students receive small group mentoring from their teachers and participate in weekly social-emotional learning workshops with our program's psychologist. Victor's Vision students participate in one exploratory field trip outside of their community each year, in addition to in-community volunteer experiences at the local shelter and elderly home.

Family Engagement: Parents participate in monthly workshops and regular home visits, discussing the value of long-term education and relevant issues in their lives.

Post-Secondary Placement: Victor's Vision's program areas are designed to lead to high school graduation and acceptance to university, technical school, or other professional post-secondary placement such as the military. Our students are supported with their university applications, exam preparation and exam fees.



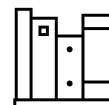

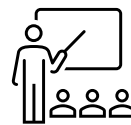
